COVID-19 UPDATE

As of July 2, 2020, Hawai'i State Department of Health provided the following COVID-19 Statistics:

Total Positive Cases Statewide: 926

Statewide released from isolation: 741

Statewide Deaths: 18

Oahu cases: 659

Hawai'i has seen an upsurge of 170 new Covid-19 cases in June, compared to 46 cases in May. Planned Health Director, Dr. Bruce Anderson said, "Despite our recent spike in cases, all of our testing and contact tracing procedures are working exactly as intended."

The majority of new cases are associated with community clusters in large households with crowded conditions, adult care and nursing facilities.

Hawai'i State Epidemiologist Dr. Sarah Park said, "These clusters really emphasize our call for the continuation of safe practices, including physical distancing, using face coverings, frequent hand washing, staying home and away from others when sick. Virtually all of the newly reported cases of COVID-19 are due to community spread, often from a group setting."

There has been speculation that the rise in COVID-19 cases in June may be due to large protests on Oahu. Dr. Park said, "At this time there is no evidence that recent protests have led to the spike in COVID-19 cases in Hawai'i. Nonetheless, we continue to strongly encourage physical distancing and the use of face masks when people are engaged in practicing their First Amendment rights or while with people who don't live in the same household."

TENANT REMINDERS

- All sidewalk sales and promotional activities held outside of a Tenant's space, must be covered under the Tenant's liability insurance. A copy of the "Certificate of Insurance" must be submitted to Meridian Pacific prior to this event.

- If you are a new employee or have a new vehicle, please register your car with the Management Office. All store employee vehicles must park in the designated stalls marked with a white dot.



EASTBOUND/WESTBOUND BETWEEN LEOKANE STREET AND LEOKU/LEO'OLE STREET

Monday-Friday 6am-5:30pm | Some Weekends Extension of work: Through July 2020



Hawaiian Dredging Construction Company, Inc. (HDCC) and the Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation (HART) will be closing single lanes of traffic on Farrington Highway, in both eastbound and westbound directions, between Leokane Street and Leoku/Leo'ole Street. These closures are expected to continue through the month of July, on weekdays from 6am to 5:30pm.

Some weekend work may be required to safely facilitate completion of the overhead canopy work at the Ho'ae'ae station. All driveways and business access will be maintained within the canopy construction zone.
